# <u>Technology Licensing Office Overview:</u>

## **Position Overview:**

Reporting to the Associate Director, IP, the IP Portfolio Manager provides timely, subject matter expert patent advice, guidance and insights to the Associate Directors, Licensing and Licensing and Business Development Managers (Licensing Team) on patent management matters. The role assumes a wide range of responsibilities related to the filing, prosecution, maintenance and defense of MIT's patent portfolio.

# Principal Duties and Responsibilities (Essential Functions\*\*):

# **IP Portfolio Management/Support**

- Support the Licensing Team at the direction of the Associate Director, IP.
- Research, compile, organize and present information and recommendations regarding specific patent portfolios, to the applicable Licensing Manager.
- Responsible for liaising with outside patent counsel to implement the timely filing of patent
  applications, office action responses and other necessary activities consistent with established
  strategy set by the Licensing Team to ensure a strong IP portfolio for commercialization.
- Analyze recommendations provided by MIT's outside patent counsel (and inventors and licensees, as applicable) on patent actions, and provide expert advice about such to the responsible Licensing Manager to ensure the proposed patent strategy aligns with the overall case commercialization strategy.
- Review MIT IP assets, highlighting opportunities for optimizing portfolio protection including recommendations for abandonment of pending patent applications and issued patents.
- As requested by Licensing Managers or Senior Leadership, perform in depth review of IP assets or portfolio (such as by investigator or technology or market) that may support patent management and targeted marketing to potential commercial licensees.
- In coordination with Licensing Managers, meet with inventors and licensees to solicit, compile and synthesize IP asset information and insight as it relates to active patent prosecution activity, issued patent assets, portfolio reviews and potential enforcement activity.



 Coordinate and collaborate closely with IP Paralegals and Technology Licensing Associates on all IP Portfolio Management activity.

# **Quality Control**

- Responsible for allocation of work to approved law firms, including review of work estimates, management of patent portfolio budgets, and providing support to the Finance department for review of and approval of legal bills.
- As requested by Associate Director, IP, assess quality of patent filings and produce data on specific law firm performance.
- Provide expert advice on patentability, white space analysis, and patent family mapping for complex and high-potential patent portfolios.

#### Other

- At the request of Licensing Managers, communicate with inventors, sponsors, patent attorneys, various members of the MIT innovation community and other TLO staff about portfolio related IP matters.
- Develop and maintain strong relationships with other university, research institutions or joint owners' technology transfer or IP organizations to ensure appropriate protection of MIT jointly owned IP.
- Ensure appropriate documentation, records and notes related to IP strategy, are maintained and appropriately stored in database systems, workflow and document management systems.
- Other duties as assigned.
